Members of the Surry County Schools' middle school robotics teams competed this week in regional qualifying events. Central Middle, Gentry Middle, Meadowview Magnet Middle, and Pilot Mountain Middle Schools competed and each of these schools hosts two First Lego League teams. The regional qualifying tournament itself is one of the larger events in the state, having a total of 24 teams who registered to participate.

Teams are evaluated in 4 areas; Innovative Project, Robot Design, Core Values, and Robot Runs. The first three areas were judged virtually during the past week with both in-person and virtual Robot Runs taking place over the weekend. High-scoring teams will advance to the state competitions.

Team 7899 of Central Middle School, CMS Cruisers, received recognition for Innovative Projects and will move forward to the state-level competition in January. Team 7901 of Central Middle School also received an Innovative Projects Award and had scores that qualified them to move forward to the state competition. Team 7908 of Pilot Mountain Middle School will serve as an alternate for the state-level competition.
